If your interest is medical then you might have heard of Jiggers. They are a parasitic sand fly and they thrive in poor hygiene, and breed in the human body and cause deformities, even death. During our outreach visits to the villages with Dr Bayer we have found many children suffering from jiggers but they can be contained with chemicals. We need to buy the chemicals to treat the children and that obviously costs more money. At the outreach sessions Dr Bayer checks the children for various illnesses and gives out vitamins and worming tablets, now he needs the chemicals to keep Jiggers at bay.
